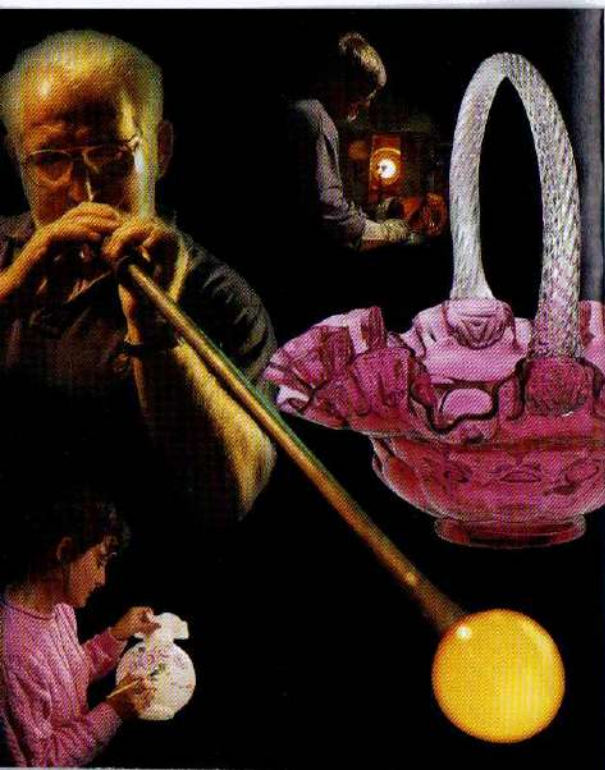

Each piece of Fenton glass is born in the fiery furnaces of our plant in Williamstown, West Virginia. Using techniques and tools reminiscent of the rich history of American glassmaking, our talented artisans transform sand, soda ash and lime into beautiful works of art for generations to enjoy. At the heart of this age-old process is the Gatherer, who skillfully twists a fiery gob of molten glass on a long steel "rod," and the

There may be as many as 28 glassworkers needed to complete one piece!
