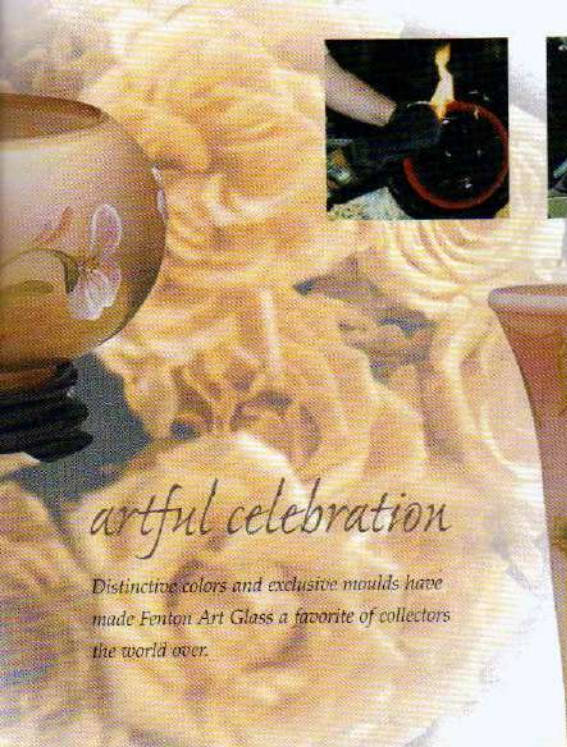

# marks of craftsmanship



Your new piece of Fenton may have as many as four "signatures" that testify to the skill of Fenton artisans. Since 1973, one of the Fenton logos has been pressed or etched into each piece.



Each handpainted item is proudly signed by the artist.



The Fenton sticker indicates that your piece meets Fenton quality standards.

Each Fenton basket bears an individual "handler's mark" stamped into the base of the handle. Thus each basket is personally marked by a craftsman. Shown here are the marks for each current Fenton handler.
